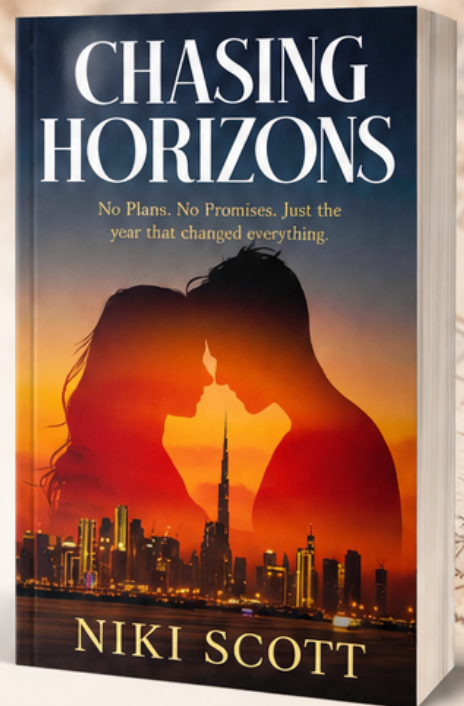

and dive into the conversation.
Here are some questions to get you started.

Lexi and Ji-ho begin their journey with a “No Romance” contract. Do you think the contract genuinely protected them, or did it simply allow them to avoid admitting what was happening between them?

Both Lexi and Ji-ho are running from expectations placed on them by their families and their futures. Who do you think needed the year away more, and why?

They agree to travel together as two strangers with separate finances, clear boundaries and no promises beyond the trip. Would you ever make that kind of agreement with someone you had only just met? What would be your biggest concern?

Their relationship becomes emotionally intimate long before it becomes romantic. At what point did you think they had already crossed the line from friendship into something more, even if neither of them was willing to call it love?

Travel strips both Lexi and Ji-ho of many of the things that usually define them: career, family reputation, routine and social expectations. Do you think they fell in love with each other, or with the versions of themselves they were able to become while travelling?

The “no post-trip contact” rule becomes increasingly difficult as the year progresses. Was keeping that clause realistic, or do you think one of them should have challenged it sooner?

Lexi and Ji-ho experience different countries, cultures and situations together throughout the year. Which destination or experience felt like the biggest turning point in their relationship, and why?

They ultimately choose to separate in Argentina rather than abandon the agreement they made at the beginning. Did you respect that decision, or were you frustrated with them for going through with it?

The novel asks whether love always needs an immediate promise of forever. Do you think Lexi and Ji-ho’s relationship would have developed in the same way if they had started the journey intending to become a couple?

By the end, they have changed considerably from the two strangers who met on the flight to Dubai. Who do you think changed the most, Lexi or Ji-ho, and what do you think was the most important change?
