

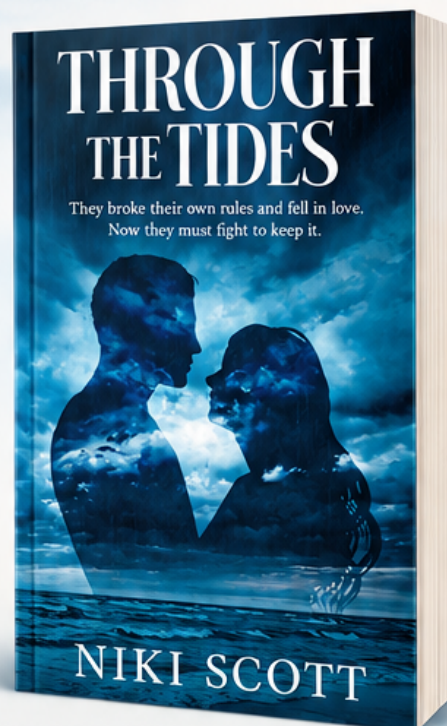

Here are some questions to get the
conversation started.

Lexi and Ji-ho reunite in Dubai after three months apart and finally allow themselves to have the relationship they denied throughout *Chasing Horizons*. After a year of resisting their feelings, did their decision feel inevitable, or did you still have doubts about whether they could make it work in the real world?

Both families reject Lexi and Ji-ho's relationship, despite them having known each other and travelled together for a year. Were either family's concerns understandable, or did you see their opposition as prejudice, control or fear of losing their child?

Lexi disappears while Ji-ho is away on a work trip, leaving him devastated. How did her decision affect the way you viewed Lexi? Did you understand why she left, or did Ji-ho deserve more from her?

After losing Lexi, Ji-ho throws himself into building his tech start-up, which he eventually sells. Do you think his ambition during those two years was driven by genuine purpose, heartbreak, avoidance or a mixture of all three?

When Lexi and Ji-ho reconnect two years later, they are no longer the same people who parted. Do you think enough had changed for their relationship to deserve a second chance, or were they simply unable to let go of their first love?

Lexi and Ji-ho's interracial relationship faces resistance from both families. How much of that opposition do you think comes from cultural differences, prejudice, parental expectations or simply fear of the unfamiliar? Can love ever truly be just between two people when families and cultures are so deeply involved?

After Lexi is attacked and loses her memory, Aaron prevents Ji-ho from seeing her, even though she is pregnant with his child. Was Aaron protecting a vulnerable daughter, interfering in her life, or both? At what point, if any, did his actions become unforgivable?

Ji-ho has to face the possibility that Lexi may never remember loving him. If someone loses every memory of a relationship, do you think love can still survive, or must the relationship essentially begin again?

Ji-ho's Christmas Day accident, while Lexi is in Boston with their twins, finally changes Aaron's attitude towards him. Why do you think it took the possibility of losing Ji-ho for Aaron to recognise what he meant to Lexi and their children? Did Aaron redeem himself for you?

After separation, two years apart, family opposition, memory loss, pregnancy, twins and nearly losing each other again, Lexi and Ji-ho finally marry officially. Did their wedding feel like their happily-ever-after, or did the novel convince you that choosing each other repeatedly mattered more than the ceremony itself?
